Agenda:

1) Call to Order

Chair Spenrath called the meeting to order at 9:34 AM CST. A roll call of the planning group members was taken to record attendance and a quorum was established prior to calling the meeting to order.

2) Welcome

Chair Spenrath welcomed members and other attendees to the meeting.

3) Approval of minutes from the previous meeting

The draft meeting minutes of September 15th were reviewed.

Kirby Brown moved to approve the minutes, seconded by Patrick Brzozowski. The motion passed by a vote of 10-0.

4) Public comments– limit 3 minutes per person

Chair Spenrath called for public comments on all agenda items.

Jed Darland provided comments related to the RFPG meeting and events occurring after the meeting on September 15th, LCRA's response and filings with the Attorney General related to his open records requests, Chapter 18 of the United Nations Agenda 21, and his opinion that the regional flood planning group does not consider public comment.

5) TWDB Update

Tressa Olsen reported that on 10/19 the TWDB sent out a request for feedback regarding preliminary input and suggested changes to state and regional flood planning rules for the second cycle of flood planning. TWDB is requesting that all written feedback be submitted back to the TWDB by November 18th.

6) Update from RFPG liaisons

Ann Yakimovicz reported that Region 9 postponed its November meeting due to limited comments.

Ron Fieseler reported that he attended a FEMA organized and sponsored county hazard mitigation plan revision process meeting. FEMA discussed various hazards like tornadoes, hurricanes, and will be looking at low water crossing issues and updating flood planning maps. Most people in attendance were unaware of the regional flood planning groups. They are now aware of the Region 10 and Region 11 flood plans.

Frances Acuna reported that she has received feedback from the residents that the draft plan was too complicated for them to understand and did not address the issues they are having.

7) Update from the Planning Group Sponsor

Lauren Graber explained the window for nominations for the vacant water district position is open until November 30th and nominations may be submitted through the RFPG website.

8) Discussion and potential action to approve mileage expenses for reimbursement

Lauren Graber presented the latest voting member mileage expenses for reimbursement. Kelly Payne moved to approve the mileage expenses, seconded by Ann Yakimovicz. The motion passed by a vote of 10-0.

9) Discussion and potential action to approve administrative expenses for reimbursement

Lauren Graber presented the latest sponsor administrative expenses for reimbursement. Kirby Brown moved to approve the administrative expenses, seconded by Brandon Klenzendorf. The motion passed by a vote of 10-0.

10) Discussion and potential action to authorize the Planning Group Sponsor to take all necessary steps to reallocate task budgets in the regional flood planning grant contract and technical consultant subcontract

Lauren Graber presented a revised task budget. This will allow unspent funds from other tasks to be placed in Task 12. The consultants will then be able to reallocate funds amongst the consulting teams to complete Task 12 work. Sponsor funds are not being reallocated with this adjustment.

Ann Yakimovicz moved to authorize the planning group sponsor to reallocate task budgets for the regional flood planning grant contract and technical consultant subcontract, seconded by Patrick Brzozowski. The motion passed by a roll call vote of 10-0.

- Discussion related to the next cycle of regional flood planning and TWDB rule revisions and guidance.
- Potential future budget adjustments in 2023.

12) Consider date and agenda items for next meeting

After general discussion, Chair Phillip Spenrath concluded that the next meeting will be held on Thursday, December 15 at 9:30am CST with an Executive Committee meeting after the RFPG meeting. The RFPG will meet January 5th for final adoption of the plan. The Technical Committee will meet on December 1st.

- Review and potentially approve additional FMXs generated from comments received on the draft plan.
- Discuss and review the draft regional flood plan including other changes made as a result of comments received.

13) Adjourn

Kelly Payne made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Patrick Brzozowski. The motion passed 10-0 and the meeting was adjourned at 10:51 AM CST by Chair Phillip Spenrath.

There are 15 regional flood planning groups in Texas. Region 10 is the Lower Colorado-Lavaca Regional Flood Planning Group (RFPG). Their draft Regional Flood Plan (RFP) is now available for review and comment.

About the Texas Flood Plan

This first-ever flood planning process was mandated by the Texas Legislature in 2019. The regional planning process began in Fall 2020. All 15 regions must deliver their final Regional Flood Plans to the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) in January 2023.

Regional plans are important. They contain recommended flood mitigation actions to reduce flood-related loss of life, property and livelihoods throughout each region.

The plans recognize flood risk areas and recommend Flood Mitigation Studies or Strategies and Flood Management Projects—all of which will have better access to future State funding to help fix local flooding issues.

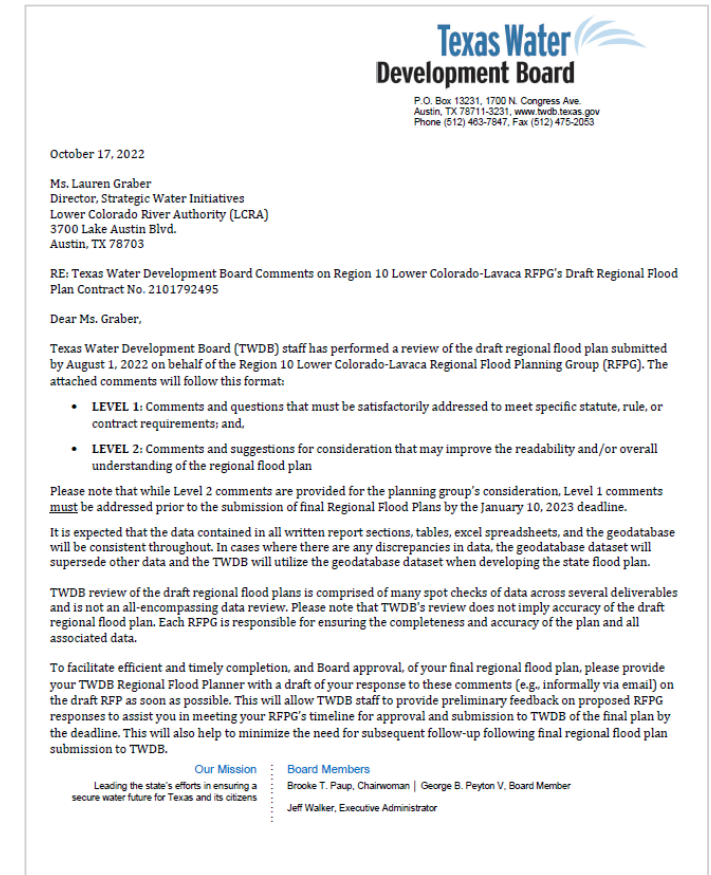

Including recommendations from a WPP when evaluating requests for financial assistance for FMSs and FMPs would ensure that proposed flood mitigation activity integrates with solutions to water quality problems that can occur across multiple jurisdictions. |
| 8.3.10 | Include a soil scientist representative from the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board (TSSWCB) as a nonvoting member of each Regional Flood Planning Group. | TSSWCB soil scientists work with communities to prepare Watershed Protection Plans. They participate in coordinated frameworks for implementing water quality protection and restoration strategies. Their input can help the RFPG take a wider view to identify appropriate flood mitigation solutions, both structural and non-structural, especially Nature Based Solutions. |
